# Providence Hood River Memorial Hospital Foundation



## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Providence Hood River Memorial Hospital Foundation supports dozens of programs including hospice care, free cancer screenings, cardiac rehabilitation, diabetes education, free youth cardiac screenings, free bike safety helmets, palliative care and more. Population health is our focus.

Here's a sample of the foundation's impact on our community:

- **450** free breast cancer screenings for women in the Gorge
- **250** free safety helmets provided to kids each year
- **67** free cardiac screenings for youth ages 12-18
- **4** teams of Jesuit Volunteers offering a year of services at Gorge non-profits
- **1** Mission to create healthier communities, together

### Activities for 2015:

- Provide supportive services for patients receiving cancer treatment, dialysis, diabetes care and cardiac rehabilitation.
- Assist elderly community members through service provision in their homes, in assisted living, supportive housing and nursing home residency.
- Ensure local uninsured and underinsured women receive free annual mammograms.
- Provide support to individuals and families who are experiencing a terminal illness.
- Help children-in-need to receive dental care for severe dental disease.
- Support hospital staff in seeking advanced training in their fields to improve patient care.
- Assist hospital departments to purchase new equipment that will enhance patient care.
- Provide wrap-around palliative care services to some of our most vulnerable patients
- Help fund a medication assistance advocate that will procure over \$750,000 in free medications for qualified patients with chronic conditions

## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The United Way of the Columbia Gorge is a non-profit organization that is changing thousands of lives in our community by funding a diverse group of local programs that serve basic human needs and foster healthy independence. When you give to the United Way, your contribution supports the entire community — serving many age groups and demographics.

Here's how it works: local non-profit agencies throughout the Gorge need financial support beyond their own an-

nual fundraising efforts to keep their programs running and provide children and adults the services they desperately need. Each year, any non-profit program from Hood River, Klickitat, Sherman, Skamania and Wasco Counties is welcome to apply for United Way funding by completing a rigorous screening and interview process to demonstrate how their program will directly help people living in the Gorge.

A team of volunteer Gorge residents representing the five counties selects

funding recipients based on stringent standards in governance, ethics, financial management and efficient/effective program operations. Each funded program must also provide detailed reporting on how funding was used with outcome results.

**Since our inception in 2006, we have invested over \$1.3 million into our Gorge community. In 2014, the United Way of the Gorge allocated \$185,000 to 33 local agencies.**

## Giving Opportunities

With over 50 volunteers throughout the Gorge, the money we allocate to local agencies is all raised by local people — neighbors helping neighbors. We are proud to say that 100% of the money donated directly by individuals, and through employee payroll deductions, gets channeled to local non-profit programs, as our sponsorship/event income covers all overhead costs.

**Make a Donation:** Donate a one-time gift, set up an employee matching funds program, or contribute through a monthly

payroll deduction. You can donate to the general fund, or designate your donation to a specific agency or county.

**Conduct a Company Campaign:** Invite our volunteers to inform your employees of United Way's work in the Gorge, and give them the opportunity to become involved as volunteers or financial supporters through a payroll deduction. Corporate gifts and employee matching funds bolster the giving power of your company.

**Volunteer:** Our work is powered by volunteers. We invite you to be a part of one of our three Gorge councils — Wasco/Sherman, Hood River and Klickitat/Skamania — or serve on our volunteer allocations committee.

# Habitat for Humanity

## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

As the gap between wages and affordable housing continues to grow here in the Gorge, more low-income families than ever are in desperate need of a decent place to live. That is why Mid-Columbia Habitat and The Dalles Area Habitat merged to become Columbia Gorge Habitat for Humanity. We now serve families in Wasco, Hood River, and Klickitat counties.

Habitat for Humanity is not a handout program -- it is a "hand up" program, helping families realize their dream of home ownership. Every family we partner with invests hundreds of hours of "sweat equity" working alongside volunteers to help build their home. When construction is complete, every Habitat family pays an affordable 0%-interest mortgage. Their mortgage payments are recycled back into our Habitat building fund to build more homes for families in need.



## GIVING OPPORTUNITIES

### Donations:

Donations of cash, pledges of support over time -- every penny counts. Land donations or the opportunity for Habitat to buy your property/land at a reduced price are welcome.

Donations of building materials make it possible to build affordable homes for families in need.

Donations of any size from individuals, families, groups or businesses all provide the base of support for Habitat.

### Volunteer:

Whether you're a student, working professional, or senior, we have rewarding volunteer positions that offer flexible schedules. Experience is not necessary to volunteer with us as we provide all needed training. Here are a few projects you might work on:

Construction -- Individuals and groups are needed to help build homes or other short-term projects for our families.

Construction experience is appreciated but not necessary.

ReStore -- A volunteer shift at the ReStore may include: loading and unloading vehicles, receiving donations, sorting materials (like lumber, small hardware, tile, tools, etc.), building displays, and maintenance duties such as sweeping, cleaning, and organizing aisles. Every day is a little different, and everything you do to help is important.

Join a Committee -- There are several committees that volunteers may join, which include working directly with our families, selecting new families, fundraising and helping with special events.

## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Learning to read is one of the most important steps in a child's life, laying the vital foundation for future knowledge and education. Research proves that shared book reading and access to books in the home during a child's first, formative years are the strongest predictors of early literacy skills. SMART provides both.

Founded in 1992, SMART's proven model engages community volunteers across Oregon to read one-on-one with PreK – 3rd grade children for one hour per week during the school year. SMART volunteers model reading aloud and ignite a love of reading in children, helping build literacy skills and self-confidence. SMART students also receive up to 14 new books to take home and keep each year.

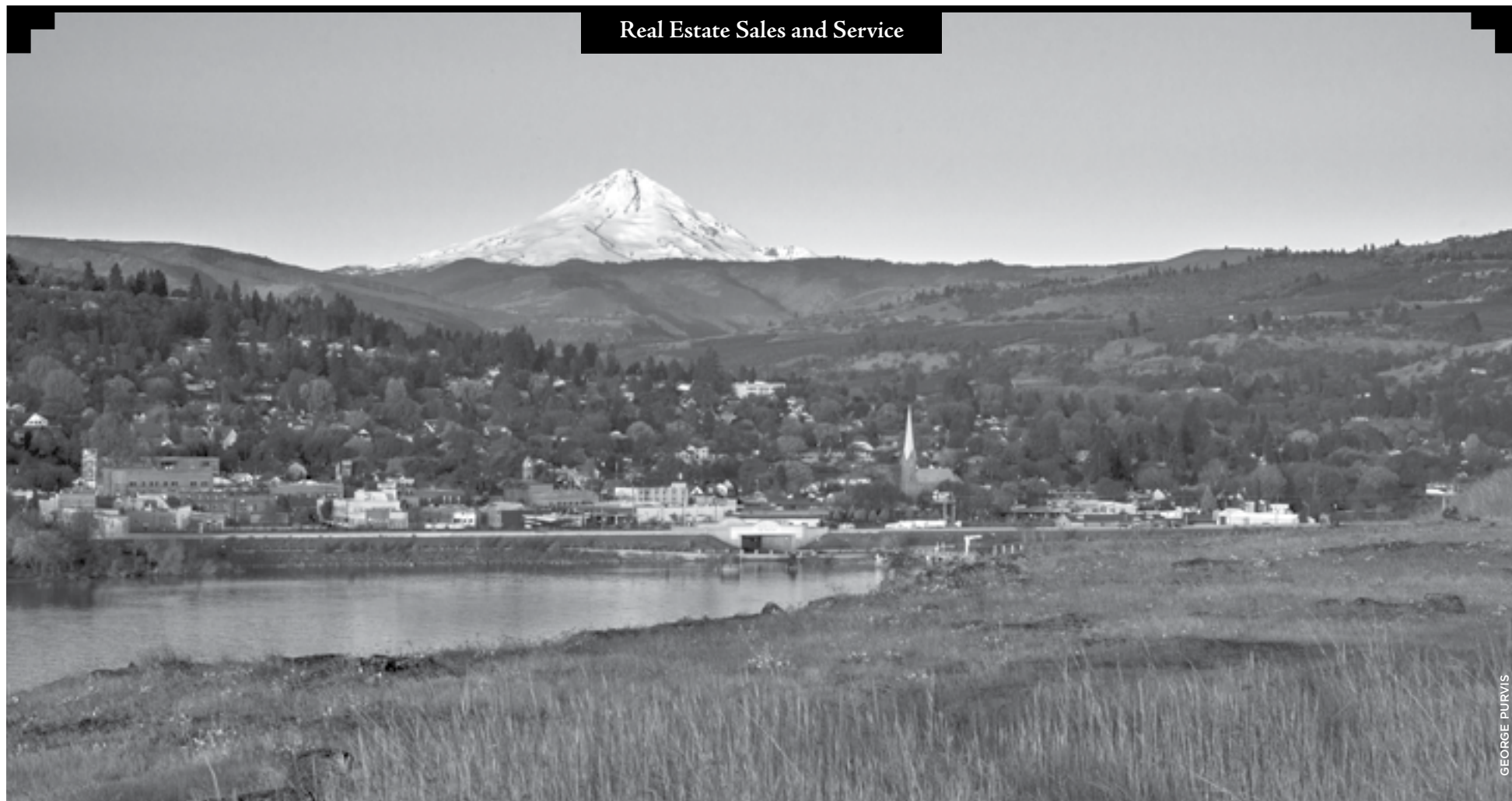

See motorcycles, military vehicles, tractors, firearms and so much more. The beacon tower out front guided mail pilots of the 20's-30's through the Gorge. Inside there's an area just for kids where they can climb into a kid-sized helicopter and submarine. For adults we offer Model T driving classes each summer.

# Columbia Gorge CASA



## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Did you know that just in the past year 84 children here in the Gorge were removed from their homes due to abuse or neglect and placed into the local foster care system? Today there are 174 children in foster care in Wasco, Hood River, & Sherman Counties - a 25% increase from this time last year.

Children enter into the foster care system traumatized and alone. Then they must navigate through that system - which is well meaning, but overburdened and underfunded. As a result, these children risk slipping

through the cracks and suffering from further abuse. CASA volunteers have the power to prevent this tragic reality. These dedicated, highly-trained community members serve as fact finders for the judge by researching the background of each assigned case. They speak for the child in the courtroom, representing the child's best interests; ensure that the child is receiving all needed services, and work to move the child as quickly as possible through the system and into a safe, loving and permanent home.

On average, children who have a CASA advocating on their behalf receive more needed services and supports while they are in care and perhaps most importantly, they have a stable adult presence in their lives during this traumatic time. Away from their families, foster children often experience multiple foster placements, case workers and attorneys. A CASA is the one person who has committed to stand by their side until they are placed in a permanent home.

# FISH Food Bank

## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

FISH Food Bank started in 1969 when a small group of community members noticed that their neighbors didn't seem to have enough to eat. They gathered some food and discreetly left it for the neighbors. They did the same thing the next week, and the next, and the next... and they haven't stopped for the past 43 years. FISH's purpose is to feed hungry people in Hood River County.

FISH Food Bank's primary purpose is to provide food for the hungry in Hood River.

To this end, FISH manages four distribution sites in the county – Hood River, Odell, Parkdale, and Cascade

Locks, with the Hood River location serving as the primary distribution and warehouse site.

Since 2007, just prior to the economic downturn, the demand at FISH has increased 65% and it has not lessened. This increase translates into a monthly average of 400+ families/individuals including children, seniors, working moms and dads, and others living below the federal poverty level. Last year, 2012, FISH gathered and distributed more than 125,000 pounds of food.

The Food Bank also has a secondary, but important function: it provides an opportunity for individuals to get involved and do something constructive in their community. In

a time where divisions in our society seem to be growing, FISH Food Bank is something that we can all agree on, at least in Hood River. Last year, more than 750 community members of all ages decided to get involved in their community by volunteering for FISH.

FISH is a member of the Oregon Food Bank and provides groceries to those in need of one-time emergency or occasional food assistance. Our mission is to provide 3 days of emergency food once per month or about 12 times per year. FISH is proud of the fact that through its four sites, food is available in Hood River County 26 out of 30 days each month.



## Giving Opportunities

For more than 40 years, FISH has survived on the generosity of this community for both food and operating expenses. FISH is continually in need of donations of food and volunteers.

Specific foods we can use include the following: any nonperishable foods, especially protein foods like tuna fish, also canned soups, stew or chili, cooking oil, foods high in nutrients like canned vegetables

and canned fruit, or whole grain foods like rice, cereal or pasta.

The food can be taken to the Hood River FISH Site at 1107 Pine Avenue in Hood River, every Monday, Wednesday, Friday or Saturday from 9:00 to 11:00 AM. Or can be placed in food box in the front of the Hood River Site.

Food is also accepted at all sites during the time food is being distributed.

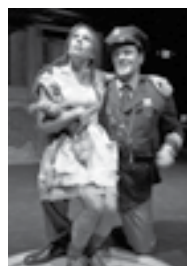

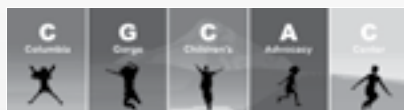

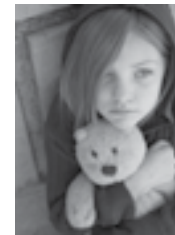

- Ensure that all children receive a medical exam in a timely manner (within the guidelines of Karly's Law).
- Minimize the impact on families (the victim and non-offending family) by reducing the number of required interviews and appointments, eliminating inappropriate interviews, and reducing lengthy travel to obtain these services.
- Provide assistance to the MDT so that they will focus on the appropriate intervention.
- Initiate victim-centered services at the time the offense is reported.

## Columbia Gorge Children's Advocacy Center

### PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Columbia Gorge Children's Advocacy Center (CGCAC) is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization founded in 2009 by a group of dedicated community members. Their vision was to create an environment where child victims of abuse could disclose abuse to law enforcement and child protective workers in privacy and safety and receive services in a child-friendly location.

Services that are provided free of charge to any child that is suspected of being abused or neglected include a medical exam and a digitally recorded forensic interview. The CGCAC forensic interviewers and doctor are trained to conduct these in-

terviews and exams, assess the child's condition, gather information, as well as document and collect evidence, thereby eliminating further exams and interviews with the attendant risk of additional trauma. They must also attempt to ensure the psychosocial well being of the child and make recommendations for treatment and follow up.

Only non-offending family members are allowed on site to help ensure that the child's safety and privacy are protected. The CGCAC reduces the trauma of abuse, and provides coordinated support services for child abuse victims to begin their healing process. Hood River

County Sheriff, Matt English, says, "The sensitive nature of child abuse cases and the laws surrounding their investigation require an expertise and specific skill set, which is imperative when interviewing children. The CGCAC has given us that resource locally."

Prior to our opening in 2009, children were interviewed at the police station or at the child welfare office, sometimes more than once. If a medical exam was necessary, it had to be done in the emergency room or the child had to be taken to the nearest child abuse center in Portland or LaGrande.

# The History Museum of Hood River County

## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

### Help Us Tell Our Story

The story of the History Museum of Hood River County started over 100 years ago with the Pioneer Society. Since then the museum has evolved into an active part of the Hood River County Community serving both residents and visitors.

The residents of Hood River County and its many visitors help cover basic operating needs such as : one staff member, an AmeriCorps person, and museum supplies. In addition, there are the costs of exhibit creation and the preservation and storage of thousands of precious artifacts, documents, and photographs. The History Museum is committed to sharing our county's history through youth education programs, community program series, and innovative partnerships with artists, actors, and other heritage and cultural organizations.

Our newly renovated atrium is a welcoming space for many community activities. Examples of its use are: the honoring those who were welcoming to the returning Japanese at the end of World War II; an exhibit by the Hood River Art Club, a meeting of the Oregon Department of Transportation, author presentation and book signing, a Forest Service presentation on Cloud Cap Lodge, and yoga classes.

The museum is fortunate to have an AmeriCorps volunteer who is responsible for coordinating and recruiting volunteers as well as creating and leading all educational activities at the museum and in the schools. This person makes sure the Traveling History Trunk which includes teaching plans and materials is ready to be borrowed by district teachers. The museum council is responsible for funding a portion of the AmeriCorps volunteer position.

## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Hood River Adopt A Dog is the non-profit organization that cares for all shelter dogs at the county-owned Hukari Shelter in Odell, OR. We provide veterinary treatment and adoption services for unclaimed lost or abandoned dogs.

Our program is successful, is well run, and continues to grow. Our three part time staff and a roster of roughly 60 volunteers work hard to make this happen - providing over 5,000 hours of care each year. Our volunteers provide twice daily care at-shelter - 365 days a year - and we have foster families who take dogs into their homes while they

await permanent placement. Each dog leaves our program in better shape than when it arrived at the shelter.

With funds raised by Hood River Adopt A Dog, all adopted dogs are spayed/neutered, vaccinated, microchipped, and, all too often, are provided urgent medical care made necessary from previous neglect or injury. We receive no tax-dollars for our services and rely on donations, small grants, fundraisers, and minimal adoption fees to do this work. In return for their care, our dogs "pay it forward" by bringing fun and love to their new families!

# HAVEN from Domestic & Sexual Violence

## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

HAVEN is a non-profit program-based agency which supports and empowers survivors of domestic and sexual violence, stalking, and dating violence. Our staff and volunteers advocate for a non-violent, non-oppressive society by providing direct services to survivors as well as prevention and education. HAVEN is the only program providing comprehensive Domestic/Sexual Violence (DSV) services for all citizens of Wasco, Sherman, Wheeler, and Gilliam counties. Additionally we partner and assist in providing services with other DSV programs throughout the Columbia River Gorge.

HAVEN began in 1981 with one woman operating a domestic violence crisis line from her home. That crisis line formed the foundation of a growing, dynamic organization which currently provides around-the-clock, comprehensive services. In addition to 24-hour crisis response for survivors, HAVEN provides ongoing services for survivors to support them in finding their personal path to health and well-being. Our expanding counseling program currently provides FREE counseling in English and Spanish for adults, adolescents, and children who have been traumatized by domestic or sexual violence. Additionally, HAVEN prevents domestic and sexual violence through Healthy Relationships education for youth in area schools and periodic presentations to adults in the larger community.

HAVEN is working with survivors and community partners to build a safe, healthy community which is free of violence.

# Columbia Gorge Ecology Institute

## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Ecology Institute's SECRETS program has served regional schools since 1996.

From a handful of classes when it began the SECRETS program now reaches almost every 5th grade classroom in a 2,000 square mile service area and is known as a leading educational resource throughout the region.

In addition, the Ecology Institute offers middle school students the opportunity to engage in meaningful scientific field surveys with natural resource professionals and biologists; provides internships in conservation stewardship and community service for high school students; engages hundreds of youth in after and out-of-school experiences of their local places;

works to restore critical habitats for rare, threatened, and endangered species of the Gorge and a multitude of other programs.

We annually serve approximately 1,000 students and work with about 100 community volunteers. More than two-thirds of our programs are provided for FREE!

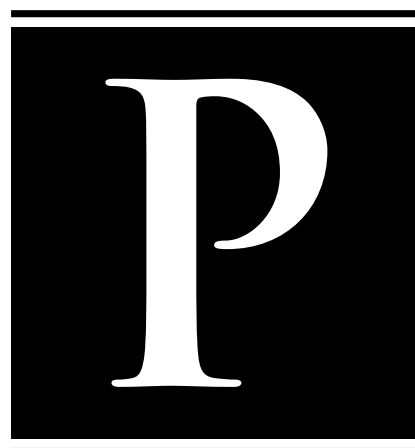

## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Mid-Columbia Senior Center is a 501(c)3 nonprofit that has been operating at its current location on the corner of 10th and Cherry Heights since 1987. We are a self-governing, community-based organization that recognizes the assets and strengths of older adults and offers opportunities and supports to live healthy and meaningful lives. The activities at the Center are open to anyone and most activities are offered on a donation basis to ensure no one is denied services because of income.

The Center leases space and works closely with Meals-on-Wheels,

another local non-profit, which offers a delicious and nutritious dinner at noon, Monday through Friday, as well as delivering meals to those who find it difficult to prepare their own meals. For more information about Meals-on-Wheels you can call them at 541-298-8333.

Knowing that it takes a whole community to support all older adults, the Center has partnered with local agencies and businesses including the Area Agency on Aging, Aging and People with Disabilities, OSU Extension, The Dalles Art Center, MCMC and Mid-Columbia Community

Action Program.

The Center operates on a shoe string budget, less than \$100,000, and depends on the generous support of the community. It receives very little from government (less than 5%) with the majority of its revenue coming from bingo, memberships, Nu-2-U Shop, rent and the many small and large donations.

- Trims and removes trees when they interfere with distribution, primary (high voltage) and secondary (individual service) power lines.

### **Engineering:**

- Works with customers to establish new service.
- Maintains the District's infrastructure.

### **Hydro:**

- NWCPUD owns and operates two hydroelectric plants.
- The Dalles North Shore Plant produces five MW. Power produced is sold to Portland General Electric with revenues credited to NWCPUD customers.
- McNary North Shore Plant produces ten MW, which is split equally with our partner Klickitat County PUD. The District's portion of the power produced is transmitted to The Dalles and is used as base load power.

### **Energy Conservation:**

- Energy audits for residential, commercial and industrial are offered free.
- Customers must complete Energy Audit Application.
- Upon completion of audit a written report will be given to customer.
- Upon completion of inspection of weatherization improvement customer may qualify for rebate.
- Heat pump rebates do not require audit; NWCPUD needs to be contacted for approved contractor listing.
- Appliance rebates are available.

### **Power Supply:**

- Over 90% of energy provided by NWCPUD is supplied by BPA and 100% is delivered to NWCPUD Substations on BPA transmission lines.

- Neighbor to Neighbor is not a welfare program. It is for emergency situations and disbursed on a case by case basis—one donation per eligible household up to \$125 in a 12 month period.
- 100% of funds collected are disbursed by Mid-Columbia Community Action Council, who determines and verifies low-income eligibility to the households in our community who "fall through the cracks". All funds collected stay right here in our community.
- Donations can be either a one-time cash donation, or PUD customers can sign up to have an amount added to their PUD bill each month. A small donation when combined with others means a million to the family who is faced with financial crisis.
- Everyone wins—donations qualify as a charitable contribution and the less fortunate receive help when it's most needed.

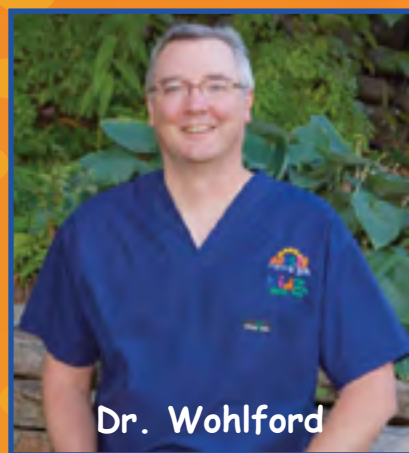

As a program of The Next Door, Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Columbia Gorge seeks to change the lives of children facing adversity for the better, forever. Our volunteer mentors ("Bigs") work one-on-one with children ("Littles") ages 6 – 18 in communities throughout Hood River, Klickitat, and Wasco Counties to build confidence, develop skills, and have fun! After a thorough screening process, Bigs are professionally matched with Littles with whom they share common

interests and compatible personalities. Once matched, Bigs and Littles spend about 8 hours per month together for a minimum of 1 year. Activities vary but often include going on hikes, cooking dinner together, trips to the movie theater, and art projects. Big Brothers Big Sisters match coordinators are there to support the match every step of the way with monthly phone calls, fun quarterly events, outing ideas, and more. Big Brothers Big Sisters helps children

achieve success in school, helps them avoid risky behaviors such as getting into fights and trying drugs and alcohol, and helps them improve their self-confidence. Littles who participate in the program are 46% less likely to begin using illegal drugs, 27% less likely to begin using alcohol, 52% less likely to skip school, and 33% less likely to hit someone. Littles are also more confident in their school performance and get along better with their families.

We help the schools, police and fire department with special needs. We have helped the parks & recreation department, the library and the hospital. We have helped other non-profit organizations in a united effort to improve our community.

As a group we volunteer hundreds of hours every year. One hundred percent of the money we raise is given back to the community or used to support international projects.

help at football games, ring the bell for Salvation Army, sponsor the Lions follies, a boy scout troop and a little league team. We recycle newspapers and Christmas trees. We meet every Tuesday at Noon at Elks Lodge 1507 for lunch and to discuss service projects. We become an extended family working together for the benefit of others.
